

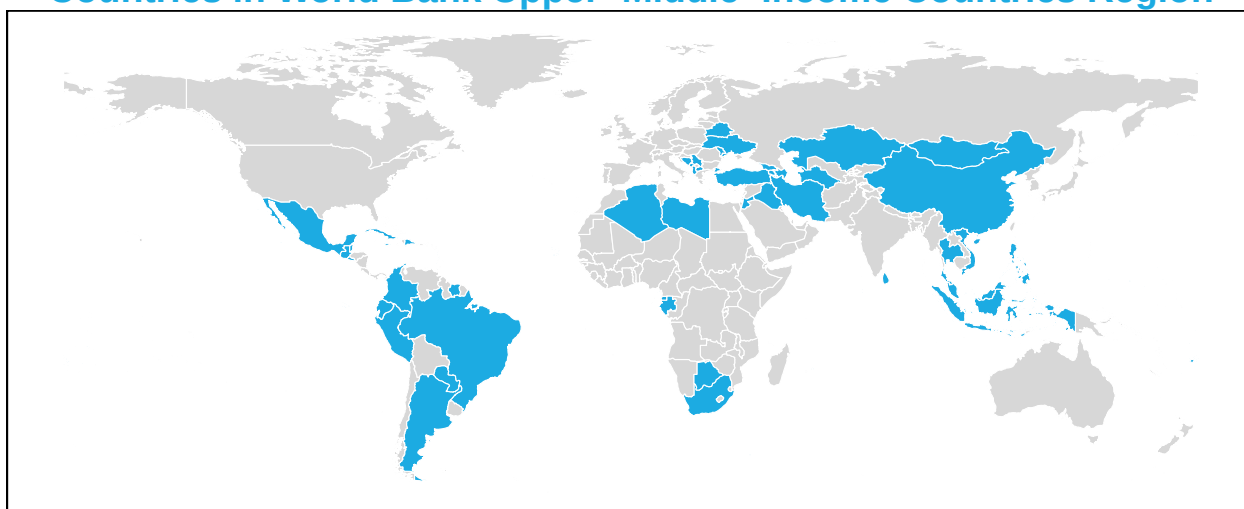

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Countries in World Bank Upper-Middle-Income Countries Region



- The World Bank Upper-Middle-Income Countries region includes the following 58 countries: Albania, Algeria, Argentina, Armenia, Azerbaijan, Belarus, Belize, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Botswana, Brazil, Cabo Verde, China, Colombia, Cuba, Dominica, Dominican Republic, Ecuador, El Salvador, Equatorial Guinea, Fiji, Gabon, Georgia, Grenada, Guatemala, Indonesia, Iran, Iraq, Jamaica, Jordan, Kazakhstan, Libya, Malaysia, Maldives, Marshall Islands, Mauritius, Mexico, Micronesia, Mongolia, Montenegro, North Macedonia, Paraguay, Peru, Philippines, Republic of Moldova, Saint Lucia, Saint Vincent and the Grenadines, Samoa, Serbia, South Africa, Sri Lanka, Suriname, Thailand, Tonga, Turkiye, Turkmenistan, Tuvalu, Ukraine, and Viet Nam.

Overview

- While noting variations across countries and vaccines, 3 out of the 14 childhood vaccines achieved an average coverage of 90% or higher within the World Bank Upper-Middle-Income Countries region in 2025.
- Coverage of the first dose of diphtheria-tetanus-pertussis-containing vaccine (DTP1) was the same in 2025 as it was in 2024 (91%), and coverage of the third dose of DTP-containing vaccine (DTP3) was the same in 2025 as it was in 2024 (88%). Coverage of the first dose of the measles-containing vaccine (MCV1) declined from 90% in 2024 to 89% in 2025.
- A total of 48 out of 58 countries reached target coverage (90%) for all 14 antigens, representing 83% of the region.
- There were 10 countries that did not meet the target coverage across all antigens: Argentina, Ecuador, Equatorial Guinea, Gabon, Indonesia, Kazakhstan, Mexico, Philippines, South Africa, and Suriname.
- In 2025, the number of zero-dose children (2.7 million) was approximately 38% higher than the annual number proposed to achieve the Immunization Agenda 2030 target of reducing the number of zero-dose children by half by 2030 in World Bank Upper-Middle-Income Countries region (2 million), based on a linear trajectory of decline.

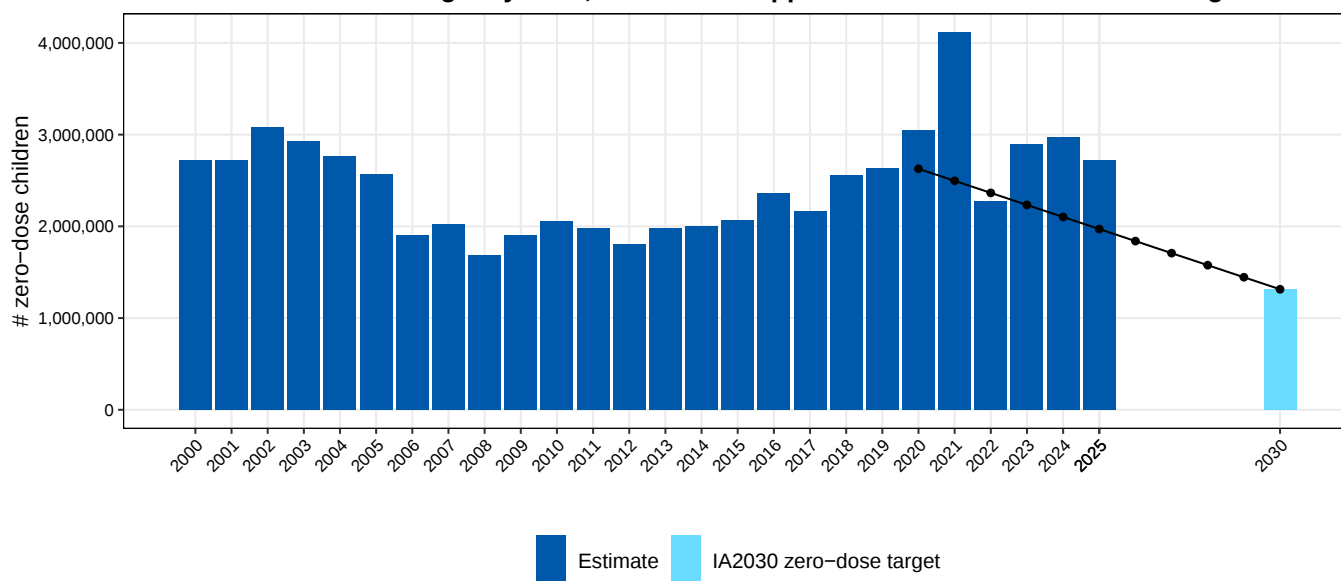

DTP1: Reaching zero-dose children

- The number of children vaccinated with DTP1 decreased 21.3% from 37.3 million in 2019 to 29.3 million in 2025.
- DTP1 coverage in 2025 was 91%, lower than in 2019 (93%) and the same as in 2024.
- In 2025, the number of zero-dose children (2.7 million) was approximately 38% higher than the annual number proposed to achieve the Immunization Agenda 2030 target in UMICs region (2 million), based on a linear trajectory of decline.
- In 2025, Indonesia and Philippines represented approximately 24% and 14% of all zero-dose children in UMICs (n = 2.7 million), respectively. Indonesia had the highest number of zero-dose children at 657,000, and Philippines had the second highest at 381,000.
- In 2025, the lowest DTP1 coverage was observed in Azerbaijan and Gabon at 65%, followed by Kazakhstan at 66%.
- There were 41 (71%) out of 58 countries in the region that achieved DTP1 coverage of 90% or higher in 2025.

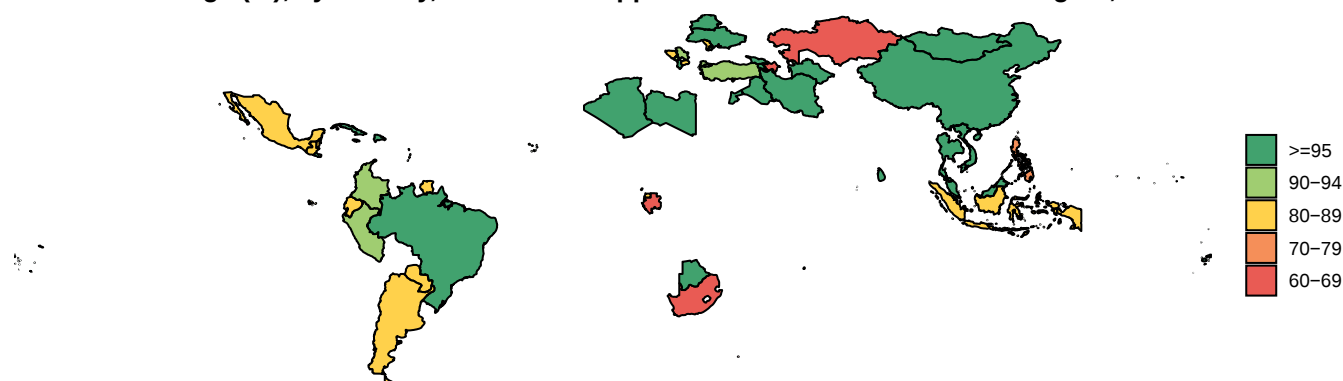

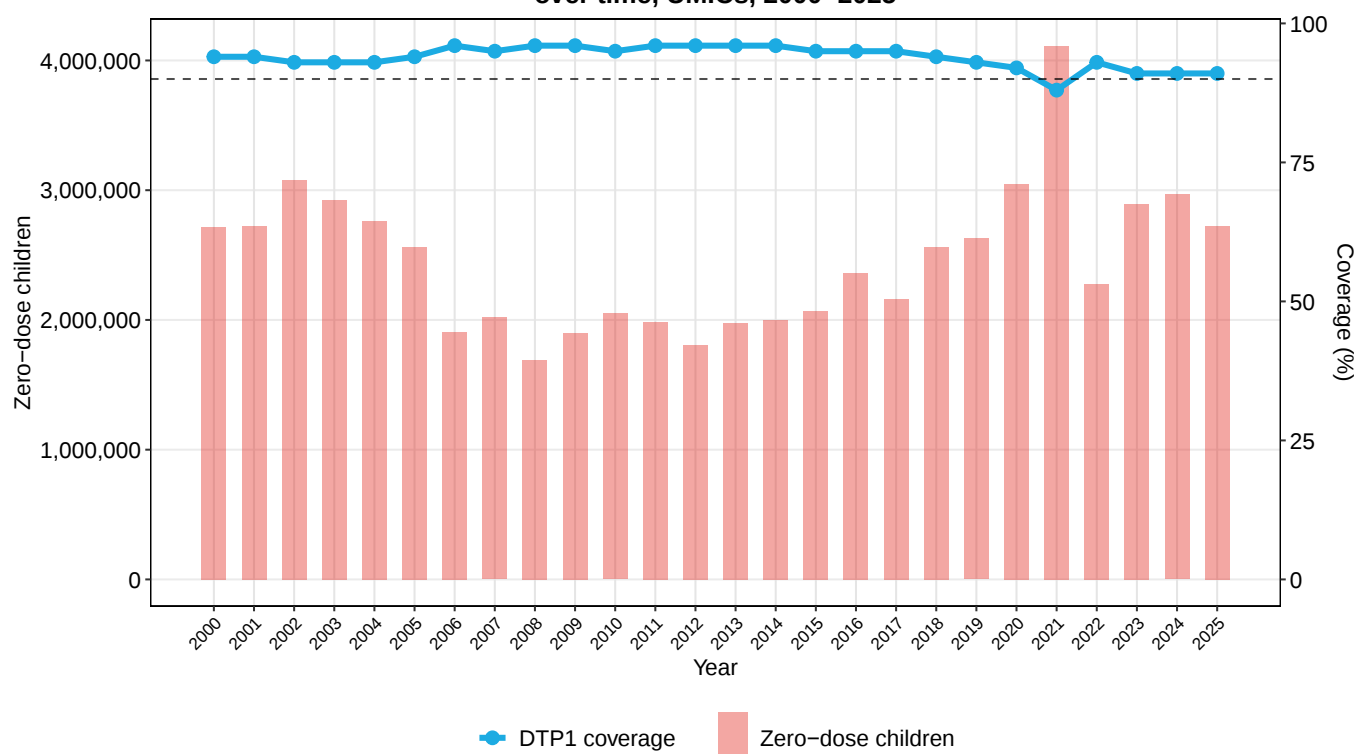

DTP3: A marker of routine immunization service delivery to children

- The number of children vaccinated with DTP3 decreased 21.9% from 36.2 million in 2019 to 28.2 million in 2025.
- DTP3 coverage in 2025 was 88%, lower than in 2019 (91%) and the same as in 2024.
- In 2025, 4% of children who received DTP1 did not receive DTP3, which was 1 percentage point higher than in 2019 (3%); low dropout rates imply good ability to provide a complete series of vaccines early in life.
- In 2025, DTP3 coverage ranged from 51% in Azerbaijan to 99% in Cuba, El Salvador, Maldives, Saint Vincent and the Grenadines, and Tuvalu.
- In 2025, Indonesia had DTP3 coverage of 82% and the highest absolute number of un- and undervaccinated children in the region (788,000), followed by Philippines with 71% coverage and 526,000 un- and undervaccinated children.

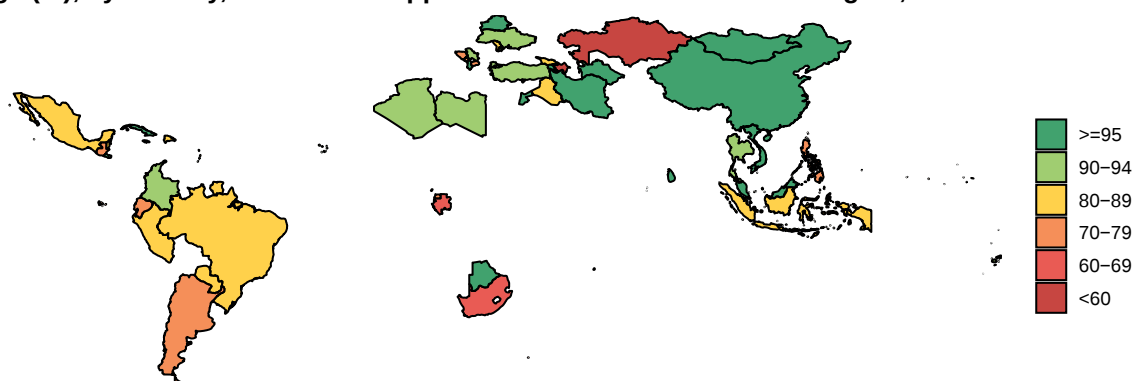

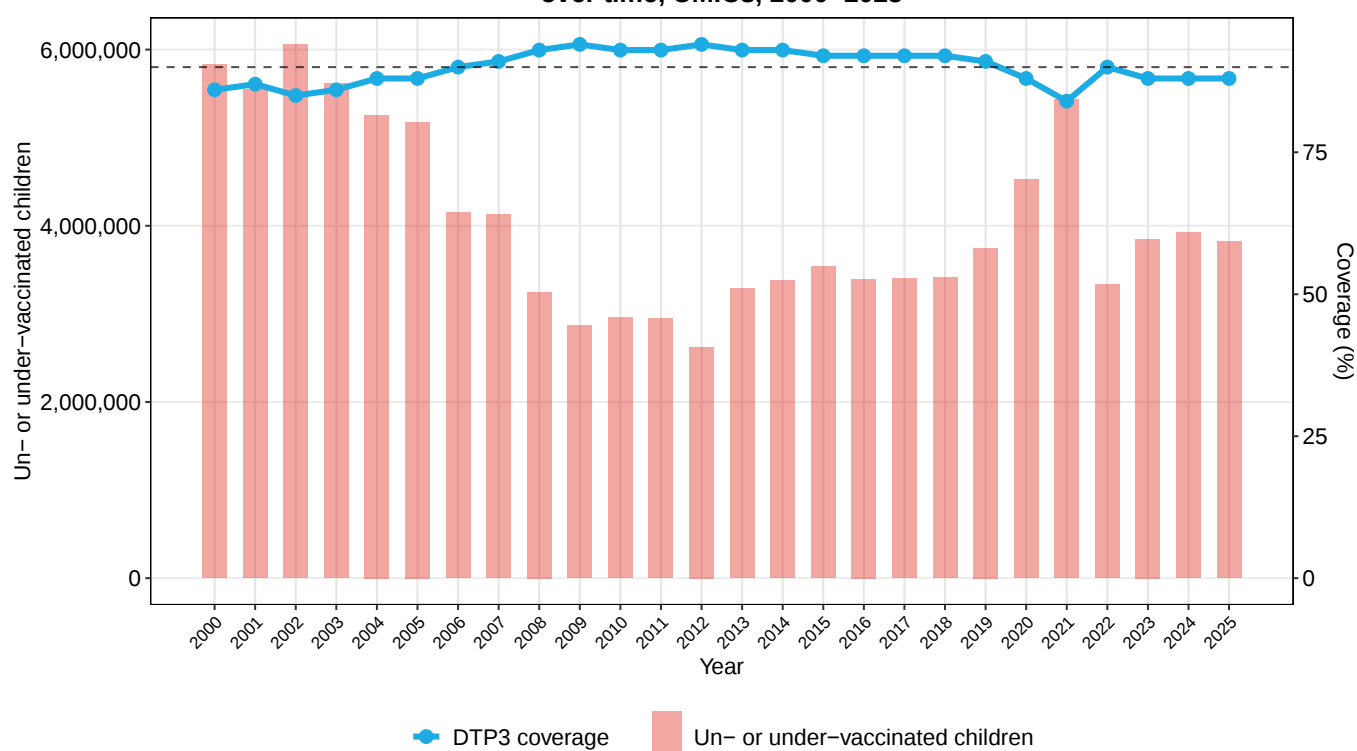

MCV: Canary in the coal mine

- MCV1 coverage in 2025 was 89%, lower than in 2019 (92%) and the same as in 2024.
- Coverage of the second dose of the measles-containing vaccine (MCV2) in 2025 was 83%, lower than in both 2019 (85%) and 2024 (85%). This leaves 3.5 million children without any protection and another 2.1 million with only partial protection against the measles virus.
- In 2025, 3% of children who received DTP1 did not receive MCV1. This 3% dropout rate was 2 percentage points higher than in 2019 (1%) and higher than the 2024 dropout rate (1%).
- Low DTP-MCV dropout rates imply good retention and ability to provide a full course of vaccines in infancy.
- 8 countries (Azerbaijan, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Equatorial Guinea, Gabon, Kazakhstan, Montenegro, North Macedonia, and Suriname) had MCV1 coverage below 80% for all of the last 3 years.
- In 2025, Indonesia had the highest number of children who did not receive the measles vaccine (657,000), representing approximately 19% of all children unprotected against measles in UMICs (3.5 million).

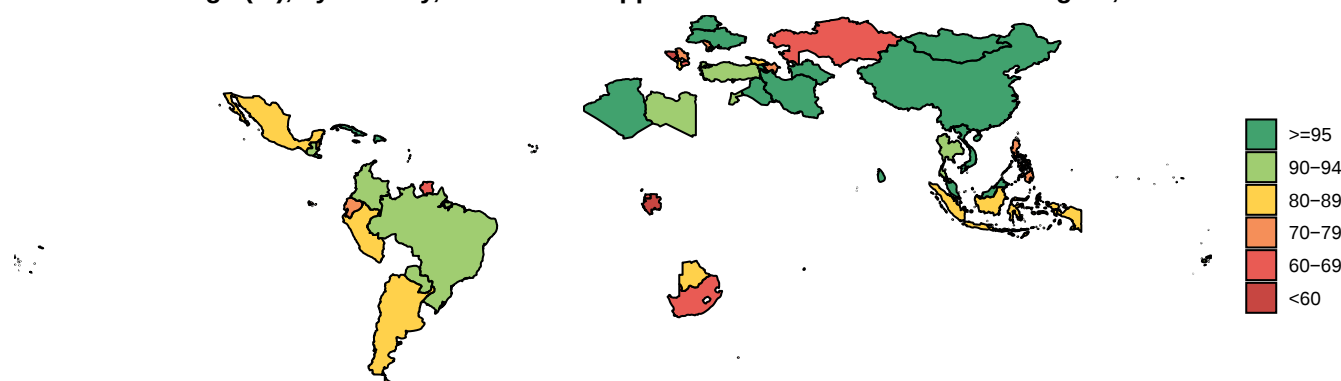

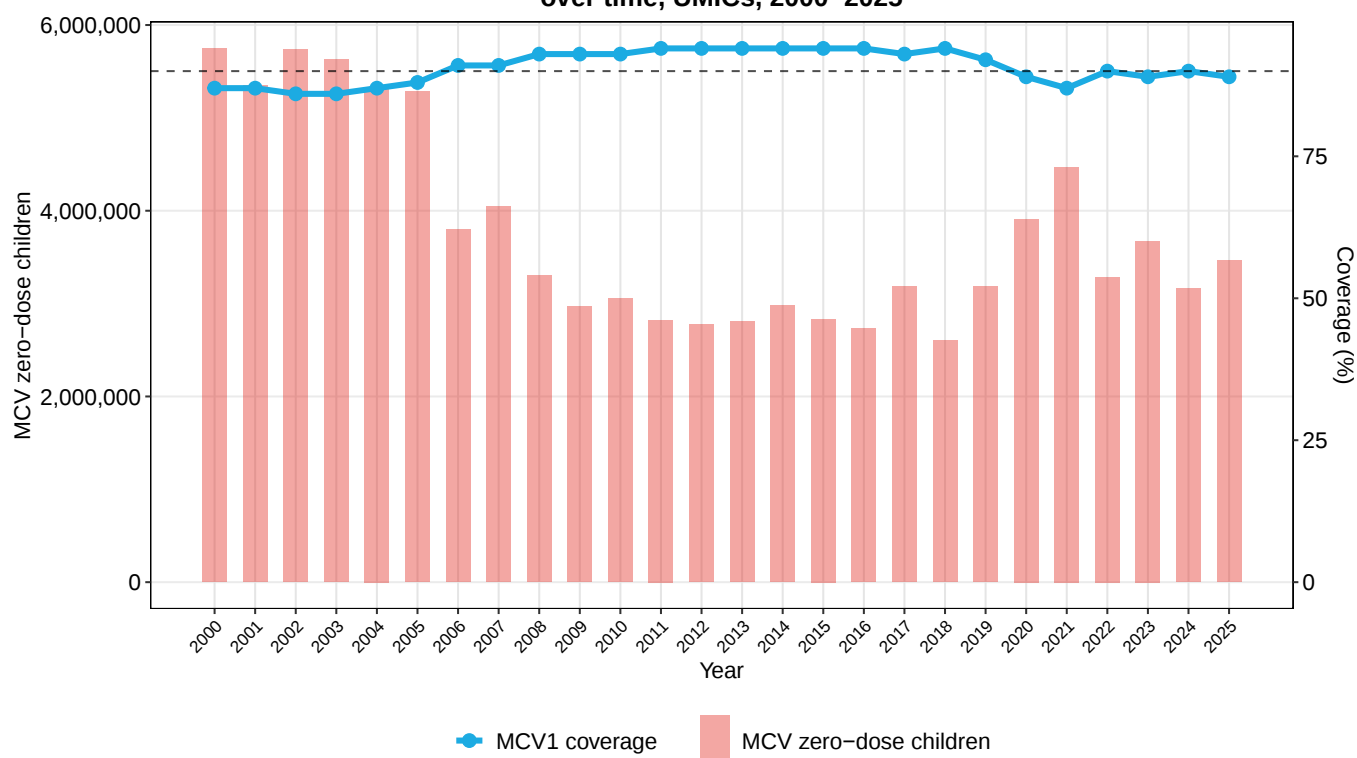

MCV coverage and MCV zero-dose children over time, UMICs, 2000-2025

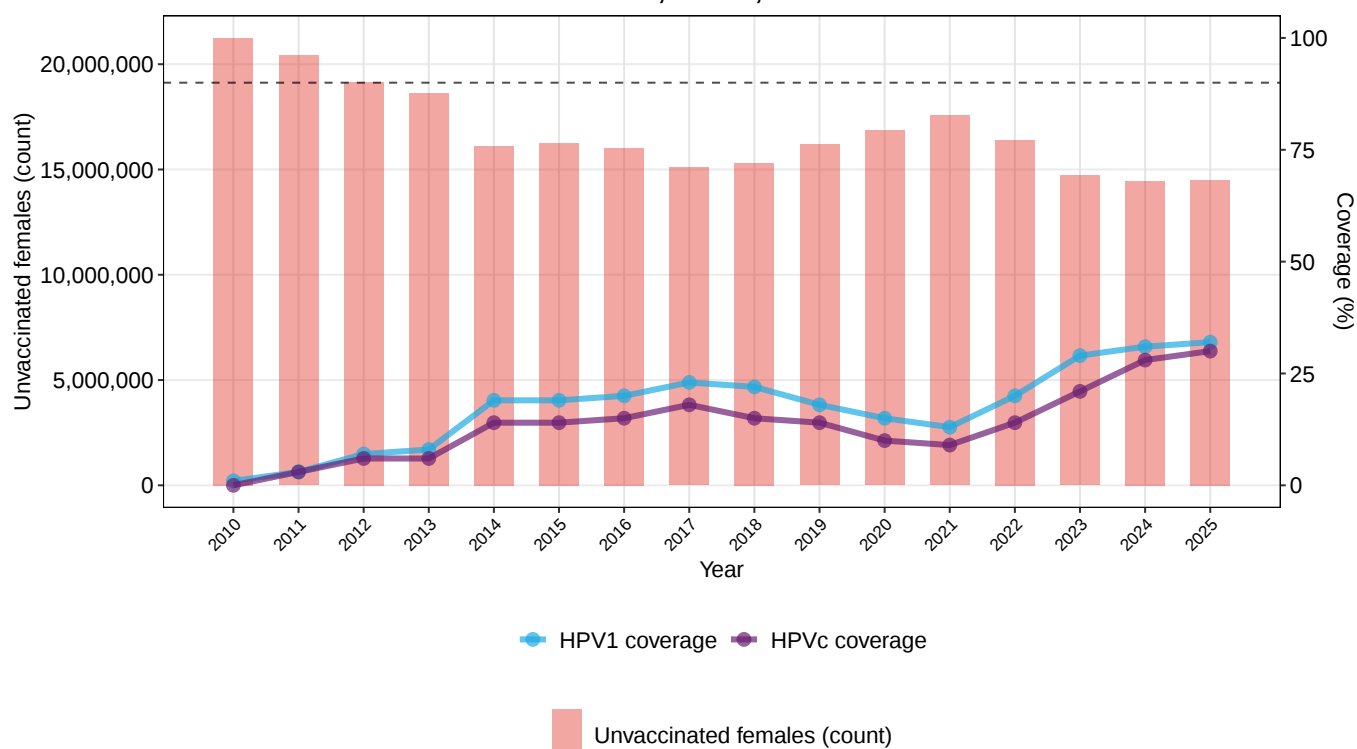

HPV

- Programme coverage of the first dose of HPV vaccine (HPV1) among girls stood at 32% in 2025, which was higher than the coverage of 31% in 2024.
- Coverage of the last dose (HPVc) stood at 30% in 2025, which was higher than the coverage of 28% in 2024.
- HPVc coverage remains well below the IA2030 target of 90%, though it is trending upward.
- In 2025, there were 14.5 million girls who did not receive any HPV vaccination.
- In UMICs, 48 out of 58 countries (83%) had introduced HPV vaccination by 2025.
 - WUENIC HPV coverage estimates are available for 46 of these countries in 2025.
 - The 2 countries that have introduced HPV vaccination but do not yet have WUENIC coverage data available for 2025 are Botswana and China.
- The 10 countries that had not introduced HPV vaccination are Algeria, Azerbaijan, Equatorial Guinea, Gabon, Iran, Iraq, Jordan, Turkiye, Ukraine, and Viet Nam.

Appendix

WHO/UNICEF Estimates of National Immunization Coverage (WUENIC)

Each year, WHO and UNICEF review national immunization data from Member States, including administrative and official coverage, survey estimates and contextual information, and use rules-based data triangulation approach to assess coverage. Estimates are produced independently, without borrowing data from other countries, and are not based on ad hoc adjustments. In some cases, they rely on a single source, typically nationally reported coverage. When data for a specific country-vaccine-year are unavailable, values from adjacent years are interpolated or extrapolated, and conflicting sources are assessed to determine the most reliable estimate, considering potential biases and expert opinion.

- Hepatitis B birth dose, given within 24 hours after birth (HepBB)
- Diphtheria, tetanus, and pertussis vaccine, first dose (DTP1) and third dose (DTP3)
- Hepatitis B vaccine, third dose (HepB3)
- Haemophilus influenzae type B vaccine, third dose (Hib3)
- Inactivated polio vaccine, first dose (IPV1) and last dose (IPVC)
- Measles containing vaccine, first dose (MCV1) and second dose (MCV2)
- Rotavirus vaccine, last dose (RotaC)
- Pneumococcal vaccine, last dose (PCV)
- Yellow Fever vaccine (YFV)
- Meningococcal A vaccine (MengA)
- Human Papillomavirus vaccine, first dose (HPV1) and last dose (HPVc)
